University of Indianapolis Hosts Grant Writing Training

On Wednesday, May 31st, the University of Indianapolis, in partnership with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Center for Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships, the HUD Indianapolis Field Office, and the IndyEast Promise Zone, hosted a capacity building and grant writing training. During this training, HUD staff presented strategies to enhance community and organizational development and to engage in successful capacity building efforts for organizations. Topics covered included creating winning connections, building organizational capacity, sharing a vision, strategic planning, budgeting and financial management, elements of a successful grant proposal, finding grants, packaging and submitting grant proposals, dispelling myths and building relationships, reading grants from the funders' perspective, logic models, and knowledge of top funders. FEDERAL FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

USDA: Food Safety Outreach Program

This program will focus on delivery of customized training to members of the target audiences. New projects will focus on, but are not limited to, addressing knowledge and resource gaps for the target audience in the areas of pre- and post-harvest water testing and sampling, soil amendments, developing supply chain programs, and/or developing food safety plans.

• Funding: Maximum of \$400,000

• **Deadline**: RFP period is open through June 6, 2017

NEH: Digital Humanities Advancement Grants

This program supports digital projects throughout their lifecycles, from early start-up phases through implementation and long-term sustainability.

Funding: Not specified

• **Deadline**: RFP period is open through June 6, 2017

NEH: Digital Projects for the Public

This program supports projects that cogently interpret and analyze humanities content in formats that will attract broad public audiences.

• Funding: From \$30,000 to \$400,000

• **Deadline**: RFP period is open through June 7, 2017

Office of Juvenile Justice Delinquency Prevention: Second Chance Act Community Supervision Reform

This program supports strategic planning that will implement evidence-based strategies to reduce recidivism and improve outcomes for juveniles under community supervision.

• Funding: Up to \$650,000

• **Deadline**: RFP period is open through June 8, 2017

HHS: Street Outreach Program

This program provides street-based services to runaway, homeless, and street youth less than 22 years of age who have been subjected to, or are at risk of being subjected to, sexual abuse, prostitution, sexual exploitation, and severe forms of trafficking in persons.

- Funding: From \$90,000 to \$200,000 per year for a period of three years
- **Deadline**: RFP period is open through June 11, 2017

Health Resources and Services Administration: Behavioral Health Workforce Education and Training

This program seeks to close the gap in access to services by establishing partnerships with a broad range of organizations and community partners to ensure a wide recruitment of students, opportunities for field placements, career development, and provide job placement services.

- Funding: Up to \$480,000per year for the Professional Track. Up to \$300,000 per year for the Paraprofessional Certificate Track.
- **Deadline**: RFP period is open through June 12, 2017

NASA: Competitive Program for Science Museums, Planetariums and NASA Visitors Centers

This program seeks projects that feature NASA-themed content in space exploration, aeronautics, space science, Earth science, or microgravity, or a combination of these topics.

- Funding: From \$300,000 to \$1,000,000
- **Deadline**: RFP period is open through June 14, 2017

SBA: Program for Investment in Microentrepreneurs (PRIME)

This program funds organizations interested in providing assistance and guidance to disadvantaged microentrepreneurs or microenterprise development organizations.

- Funding: From \$50,000 to \$250,000 over a period of one year
- **Deadline**: RFP period is open through June 16, 2017

ED: Supporting Effective Educator Development

The program provides funding to increase the number of highly effective educators by supporting the implementation of evidence-based practices that prepare, develop, or enhance educators.

- Funding: From \$1,000,000 to \$6,000,000 for the first year of the project
- **Deadline**: RFP period is open through June 19, 2017

USDOT: Low Income Taxpayer Clinic Grant

The program supports organizations providing representation, education, and advocacy for low income and English as a second language taxpayers.

- Funding: Maximum of \$100,000 per year for up to three years
- **Deadline**: RFP period is open through June 20, 2017

DOJ: Community Policing Development Program

The program advances community policing through training and technical assistance, the development of innovative community policing strategies, applied research, guidebooks, and best practices that are national in scope and responsive to the program topics.

- Funding: Maximum of \$7,500,000 over a period of two years
- **Deadline**: RFP period is open through June 23, 2017

National Institute of Food and Agriculture: Childhood Obesity Prevention Challenge Area

The program works to reduce the prevalence of obesity among children and adolescents.

- Funding: Not specified
- **Deadline**: RFP period is open through June 28, 2017

DOJ: Second Chance Act Comprehensive Community-Based Adult Reentry Program

The program supports organizations in developing and implementing comprehensive and collaborative programs that support people who are reentering communities from incarceration and are at medium to high risk of reoffending.

- Funding: Maximum of \$1,000,000 over a period of three years
- **Deadline**: RFP period is open through July 5, 2017

DOC: Economic Development Administration (EDA) Grant Opportunity

EDA provides strategic investments on a competitive merit basis to support economic development, foster job creation, and attract private investment in economically distressed areas of the US. EDA funds provide investments that support construction, non-construction, technical assistance, and revolving loan fund projects and are designed to leverage existing regional assets and support the implementation of economic development strategies that advance new ideas and creative approaches to advance economic prosperity in distressed communities. Promise Zones are considered "Special Needs" areas, and applicants should submit a letter of support from the lead Promise Zone organization.

- Funding: From \$100,000 to \$3,000,000.
- **Deadline:** Applications accepted on an ongoing basis.

DOC: Economic Development Assistance Programs – Public Works and Economic Adjustment Assistance Programs

This U.S. Department of Commerce program seeks to support projects in rural and urban areas to provide investments that support construction, non-construction, technical assistance, and revolving loan fund projects. There will be 70-150 public works awards and 70-140 economic adjustment assistance awards.

- Funding: From \$100,000 to \$3,000,000.
- **Deadline:** Applications accepted on an ongoing basis.

USDA: National School Lunch After School Snack Program

The USDA Food and Nutrition Service offers funding for schools and residential child care institutions to provide after school snacks to low-income children who participate in the National School Lunch program.

• **Deadline:** Applications accepted on an ongoing basis.

USDA: FSA Microloans

USDA's Farm Service Agency provides financial assistance for small, beginning farmer, niche and non-traditional farm ownership or operations. Non-traditional farm operations can include truck farms, farms, direct marketing farmers, Community Supported Agriculture, restaurants and grocery stores, or those using hydroponic, aquaponic, organic, and/or vertical growing methods.

• Funding: Maximum of \$50,000.

• **Deadline**: Ongoing

NON-FEDERAL FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

Santander Bank: N/A

This organization provides support for funding priorities including affordable housing, financial education, economic development, and neighborhood revitalization.

- Funding: Not specified.
- **Deadline**: RFP period is open through June 2, 2017 and again through September 8, 2017.

Crayola: School Leadership Program

This program supports innovative, creative leadership team building within elementary/middle schools.

- Funding: \$2,500 and Crayola products valued at \$1,000

This group provides small grants for short-term projects that build community agency, engage local voices, and connect to long-term community goals. Examples include creative placemaking, mapping, and community events.

Grants support and initiate running programs for kids, to fight childhood obesity.

This foundation is accepting proposals for 1) Establishing a Group Respite or Early Memory Loss Program for Elders with Dementia or 2) Expanding Supportive Services for Grandparents and Other Relatives Raising Children.

Home Depot Foundation: Veterans Housing Grants

This program provides funding for new construction, rehab or repair, single-family or multifamily, permanent supportive housing or transitional housing – hard costs only.

Finish Line Youth Foundation: N/A

This foundation provides funding to support youth athletic programs and sports-based camps, with priority given to those serving disadvantaged children and children with special needs. Programmatic grants up to \$5,000 will be awarded to nonprofit organizations for community-based athletic programs and camps that teach active-lifestyle and team-building skills. Legacy grants of up to \$75,000 will be awarded for new facilities improvements and/or renovations to existing buildings and property. Founders grants of up to \$25,000 will be awarded for emergency needs created by unforeseen circumstances such as a natural disaster or unforeseen fiscal circumstance.

• Funding: From \$5,000 to \$75,000.

• **Deadline**: RFP period is open through June 30, 2017.

David Bohnett Foundation: N/A

This foundation provides support for funding priorities including LGBT community support, gun violence prevention, cyber centers, municipal leadership, and animal language.

• Funding: From \$500 to \$2,700,000.

Target Corporation: Target Field Trip Grants

This program funds experiences that connect students' classroom curricula to out-of-school experiences, from January to June.

National Alliance for Grieving Children: Grief Reach Grant

This funding supports children's bereavement programs in order to expand their reach to underserved youth populations.

Lowe's Charitable and Educational Foundation: Learning Impact Grants

Learning Impact Grants support school improvement projects, such as facility enhancement and landscaping/cleanup. Projects with parent involvement and other community partners are encouraged.

• Funding: From \$2,000 to \$5,000.

Calvin K. Kazanjian Economics Foundation: N/A
